

Asia-Pacific leaders discuss the impact of agricultural technology transfer on sustainable development

10 February 2015, Bogor – Effective technology transfer is critical for achieving the increases in food production needed to secure future supplies, enhance the incomes of the farming community and preserve environments.

A two-day United Nations 'Policy Dialogue on the Role of Technology Transfer in Agriculture for Sustainable Development Outcomes' will hear this week that this transformation towards sustainable agriculture requires more effective innovation systems, and more support for transfer of appropriate and affordable agricultural technologies to small farmers.

The session, organized by the Centre for Alleviation of Poverty through Sustainable Agriculture (CAPSA), a regional institute of the United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP), kicks off today in Bogor, Indonesia and will bring together national leaders in agricultural research and extension from the Asia-Pacific region, representatives of civil society, academia, the private sector and international organizations to identify the steps required to develop and strengthen agricultural technology transfer at national and regional levels.

"The negotiations on the post-2015 development agenda are moving into the final stages, and the adoption of the sustainable development goals is impending," said Dr. Katinka Weinberger,
